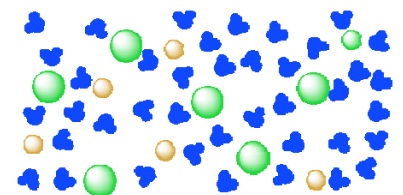

Time to Register for Camp!

Teachers say that they can tell the difference between students who have had an opportunity to go to French summer camp or have a similar experience and those that have not had this kind of experience. Students are more engaged and are more willing to speak in French after they have participated in camps.

Students aged 12-14 and enrolled in French Immersion or French language education will have the opportunity to attend camp in Îles-de-la-Madeleine at L'Istorlet Center Nautique camp July 12-18. This is a nautical camp with boogie boarding, wind surfing, sailing and more.

During this **same week** and at the same site is the Sea Kayak Camp. You will explore, by sea kayak, caves and cliffs, and in the evening, you will camp at a safe harbor on the beach for the night; a great way to discover the Islands from a different perspective. This is for 15-17 year olds .
